January Commencement Keynote Speaker



This year's commencement speaker is Fred Mangione, Chief Operating Officer, Brooklyn Nets and Barclays Center. Mr. Mangione leads an award-winning sales and marketing team and is responsible for the strategic development and implementation of marketing, branding, sales plans and customer relationship management metrics for both the team and the arena. He also manages the communications, game operations, and sponsorship departments, overseeing the development of strategic marketing and activation campaigns for corporate partners of both the team and the arena.

He has leveraged his sales background and played a key role in the transformation of the team brand from New Jersey to Brooklyn, the development of the Barclays Center brand and the five programming franchises at Barclays Center. He has redefined the sales process by focusing on branding and advertising strategy development, improving product messaging and driving sales across all marketing channels. Mr. Mangione is responsible for all revenue streams for both the Nets and Barclays Center. Under his leadership, the Nets moved from last place in the NBA to Top 5 in gross ticket sales and merchandise sales. Barclays Center became the top U.S. venue for ticket sales revenue and tickets sold within its first year of operation. In 2013, he was named Chief Revenue Officer, a newly created position for the Brooklyn Nets and Barclays Center.

Fred Mangione joined the Nets in 1999 as the Director of Ticket Sales and worked his way up the ranks. During his tenure as head of sales, his team set revenue records that still stand today. Prior to joining the Nets, he was the Director of Sales for the 1999 Women's World Cup Giants Stadium venue. He started his career in minor league sports, selling tickets and working in marketing for minor league hockey and Arena Football.

A native of Jefferson, N.J., Mr. Mangione received his Bachelor of Science Degree in Business Management and Marketing from Centenary College. He resides in Glen Rock, N.J. with his wife Jennifer, daughter Madeline, and son Mason.

Honorary Degree Recipient

Robert J. Polakowski is a lifelong resident of New Jersey from Bayonne. He obtained a Bachelor of Arts Degree from Jersey City State College in 1965 and a Master of Arts from Seton Hall University in 1970. He is a former classroom teacher in Jersey City.



Mr. Polakowski arrived in Trenton in 1971 as a field representative for membership for the New Jersey Education Association. For some seven years he was responsible for organizing and implementing an annual statewide membership campaign to raise operating funds from some 1,100 local and county affiliates. Membership grew from 72,000 to 115,000. In 1978, Mr. Polakowski became Associate Director for Government Relations representing the interests of school employees before the New Jersey Legislature and Congress. In addition, he served as campaign consultant to Democratic and Republican candidates for office at the state and national level. In 1988 Mr. Polakowski became Vice President of the Association of Independent Colleges and Universities in New Jersey, representing the interests of New Jersey's 14 independent colleges and Universities. For 26 years he focused on securing operating funds, student aid and capital construction revenue. Mr. Polakowski retired on July 1, 2014, after 36 years as a registered lobbyist.

Mr. Polakowski is a resident of Lawrenceville and the Blue Heron Golf Club in Galloway, NJ. His family includes Sona, his wife, son Mark (deceased), and daughter Jennifer, who is the Deputy Director of New Jersey Nursing Initiative (NJNI) a RWJF Program. He has two grandchildren, Collin and Reese.

Don't Forget About SAP!

SAP or Satisfactory Academic Progress is just what it sounds like – students need to “do well” in their classes in order to keep their financial aid. There are three SAP measurements Centenary College checks for each semester:

- **GPA:** Is the student keeping a good GPA
- **Pace of Completion:** Is the student completing the classes or are they dropping/withdrawing/failing classes
- **Maximum Timeframe:** Is the student going to graduate on time?

Start Preparing Now for Fall 2015 and Spring 2016

Although the new year is not quite here, it is never too early to prepare for your financial aid for the 2015-2016 year. Our priority deadline for returning students is **April 1, 2015**. By this date, the FAFSA must be filed as well as all missing documentation submitted. Many students miss out on scholarships and grants because he/she misses the priority deadline and many funds are first-come, first-served.

Did you know you can refile a FAFSA as early as January 1, 2015? When you re-file, much of your personal information is saved from the previous year, making the re-file process shorter. We recommend filing your 2014 taxes early to ensure your tax information is available in time to meet the priority deadline. Don't forget to complete the FAFSA at www.fafsa.gov.

Registration for the spring semester began on November 3rd. Students who have not registered should do so ASAP. If you are having trouble settling your fall bill, please contact our office ASAP to discuss financial aid options that could help you out.

Centenary College recently held a grand opening for the new Wellness Center for Counseling and Health. Located at 605 Grand Avenue, the Center is a newly renovated and elegant Victorian home located in an easily accessible part of campus. It offers a convenient one-stop location for the counseling and medical needs of the Centenary student population.

Disability Services Office

The mission of the Disability Services Office (DSO) at Centenary College is to provide a full range of reasonable accommodations and support services to students with disabilities in order to ensure compliance with Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 and the Americans with Disabilities Act (1990).

Based on nationally regarded best practices, the Disability Services Office seeks to foster independence and to develop the self-advocacy of students with disabilities. In addition, the office strives to serve as a liaison and resource to the members of the Centenary College community regarding disability issues.

The DSO also offers two programs specifically designed to support students with mild emotional and learning disabilities, Project ABLE and STEP Ahead. Both programs provide a "bridge" between the structured and sometimes modified secondary-school setting to the predominantly self-directed college environment. The STEP Ahead program is an intense 4 week residential pre-college program held during the summer. It is designed to enhance the development of a student's self-advocacy, independence, interpersonal and academic skills. Enrollment is limited to 12-15 students who have specific learning disabilities and whose educational background indicates a need for basic skills remediation, developmental education, or specialized supported challenges designed to address academic, social, and emotional concerns.



Veterans Day 2014



In celebration of Veteran's Day 2014 and to recognize the valor, courage, and sacrifice of those who served or are currently serving, "The Honor Tree" made its second annual appearance in front of the cafeteria in the David and Carol Lackland Center on Tuesday, November 11, 2014. In addition, student representatives from our Second Year Experience (SYE) program organized a letter writing campaign through Operation Gratitude, a California-based organization that sends over 150,000 care packages per year to deployed troops. The letters written by members of Centenary's campus community will be included in the care packages distributed through Operation Gratitude. Actor Stephen Rea & Dramatist Sam Shepard

A Public Interview with Stephen Rea and Sam Shepard took place on November 17, 2014 in the Sitnik Theatre in the David and Carol Lackland Center.

Stephen Rea is an actor and director. He has appeared in many award-winning films, including *Angel* (1982), *The Crying Game* (1992), *Interview with the Vampire* (1994), *Trojan Eddie* (1995), *Michael Collins* (1995), *The Butcher Boy* (1997), *End of the Affair* (1998), and *Breakfast on Pluto* (2004). He is also a founding director, with the playwright Brian Friel, of the Field Day Theatre Company. Field Day is currently staging Sam Shepard's *A Particle of Dread* (*Oedipus Variations*), directed by Nancy Meckler, in the Signature Theatre, New York.

Sam Shepard is a Pulitzer Prize-winning playwright and actor. Among his many plays are *Curse of the Starving Class* (1976), *Buried Child* (1979), *True West* (1980), *Fool for Love* (1983), *A Lie of the Mind* (1985), *The God of Hell* (2004), *Kicking a Dead Horse* (2007) and *Ages of the Moon* (2009). As an actor his credits include *The Right Stuff* (1983), *Fool for Love* (1985), *Steel Magnolias* (1989), *The Pelican Brief* (1993), *All the Pretty Horses* (2000), *The Pledge* (2001), *Black Hawk Down* (2001), *Mud* (2012) and *August: Osage County* (2013).

Professor Christopher Linne

Each year, the Van Winkle Achievement Award is presented to a remarkable professional of great accomplishments and outstanding service to Centenary College. This individual is someone who brings honor to our institution as well as the community at large. This year, Centenary presented the Van Winkle Achievement Award to Professor Christopher Linne. He is more than a professor here at Centenary; his achievements go beyond the classroom and beyond the College.

Besides being an Associate Professor of Criminal Justice & Sociology and Coordinator of the Criminal Justice Studies Program, Professor Linne and his family created the Linne Family Scholarships at Centenary College and county College of Morris. His accomplishments extend beyond New Jersey. He travelled to Ghana multiple times and helped various schools providing them with educational development opportunities and school supplies. He recently completed a fundraising initiative to install a water system at a public school complex that serves over 4,500 students in Brahabehome-Obuasi, Ghana.

Dr. Breandán Mac Suibhne, Associate Professor of History at Centenary College, served as the Fall 2014 Gates-Ferry Distinguished Lecturer. His presentation, *The Molly Maguires and the Politics of post-Famine Adjustment in Ireland*, took place on November 19th in the Lackland Center .

Dr. Mac Suibhne is a historian of society and culture in modern Ireland. A graduate of Carnegie Mellon University and University College, Dublin, his publications include *Society and Manners in Early Nineteenth-Century Ireland* (Dublin, 2011) and, with David Dickson, *The Outer Edge of Ulster* (Dublin, 2000; South Bend, 2001). He was a founding editor, with the critic Seamus Deane, of *Field Day Review*, a journal of political and literary culture. He is completing a book on the subject of his talk which will be published by Oxford University Press. He has also previously addressed this topic in seminars and public lectures at Cambridge University, the National University of Ireland (Galway), New York University, Quinnipiac University, the University of Ireland, and the University of Ulster.

Suzanne McCarthy, Senior Director of Academic Success and Advising Centenary will complete her first of a three-year term as the Professional Development Director on the Board of the College Reading and Writing Association. McCarthy recently attended the annual conference of the College Reading and Learning Association (CRLA) in St. Paul, Minnesota where they unveiled a new logo and an entirely redesigned website in an effort to better showcase the organization. 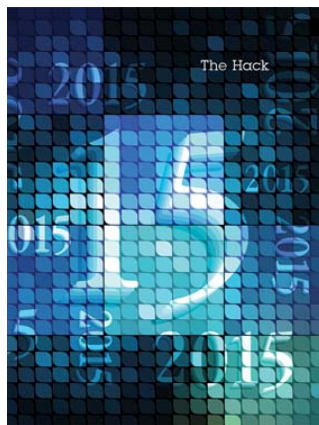
