Public Support Increases

Public officials increasingly recognize the important educational and economic contributions Centenary makes to the region and state. Thanks to this growing prominence, the State of New Jersey has invested in the future of the University—and our students—in its 2026 budget.

Recently, Sen. Douglas J. Steinhardt and Assemblyman John DiMaio were instrumental in securing a \$1.5 million grant from the State of New Jersey for capital improvements at Centenary. The University is one of seven independent New Jersey colleges and universities to share more than \$9.2 million in special appropriations from the state.

ADVANCING ACADEMICS

Academic excellence is the hallmark of a Centenary University education. Today, Centenary educates students for a new era, transcending the traditional college model to serve a broader population of students. To accommodate working adults, the University has introduced a robust menu of certificate programs that open the door to new career opportunities.

"Centenary meets students where they are," says Thomas Jordan, Ph.D., the University's vice president of academic affairs. "Some are nontraditional students—working adults or those who have never considered college. In partnership with the local business community, Centenary has introduced a series of niche certificate programs centered on workforce development."

Dr. Jordan is grateful to the benefactors who have supported Centenary's expansion into new academic disciplines, such as nursing: "For me, measuring the effectiveness of giving is always about return on investment. At Centenary, your investment yields a greater return because it directly impacts individual students, who then make a bigger impact on our communities and society at large."

Criminal Justice

Four Centenary graduates were members of the 166th New Jersey State Police Academy graduating class, reinforcing the excellent reputation of the University's criminal justice program.

Happiness Studies

Berkeley Heights Mayor Angie Devanney '26 will earn her Master of Arts in Happiness Studies from Centenary University next May. She's already applying her studies to improve lives in her New Jersey community, establishing a Mayor's Wellness Committee to promote better physical and emotional well-being for her constituents.





Veterinary Science

Class of 2025 valedictorian Sophia Wayner '25 is now enrolled in the inaugural class at the Schreiber School of Veterinary Medicine at Rowan University. She is the latest in a long line of Centenary graduates who have gained acceptance to highly competitive veterinary schools.



New Academic Leadership

Centenary University recently appointed experienced higher education administrator Thomas Jordan, Ph.D., to the position of vice president of academic affairs. Dr. Jordan supports strategic initiatives extending the University's brand as a global resource for market-driven academic and workforce development programs and providing oversight and leadership in the areas of curriculum development and faculty affairs.

A solutions-focused higher education executive, Dr. Jordan brings more than 25 years of experience in higher education to Centenary. He most recently served as provost/vice president of academic programs and services, as well as professor of sociology and music, for the State University of New York (SUNY) at Delhi. As the chief academic officer for the institution, he was responsible for planning, developing, and maintaining excellence in academic programs and services. Under his leadership, SUNY at Delhi restructured its academic schools, introduced innovative new programs, and instituted a plan to improve student retention, success, and graduation rates.

A graduate of Hunter College, Dr. Jordan earned a Master of Arts in Higher Education Administration from New York University and a Ph.D. in Sociology from The Graduate Center, City University of New York. He says, "Centenary University is a well-respected institution with a dynamic and dedicated faculty, staff, and administrators. This team is advancing an exciting plan to build on Centenary's growing reputation as an educational leader that supports the success of students from all walks of life with a broad range of career and life goals."

Medicine

Nicolas Radovanic '25 was accepted to seven medical schools and began studies at the Rowan-Virtua School of Osteopathic Medicine last July. Centenary provides outstanding support that empowers first-generation college students like Nic—a volunteer EMT in his hometown—to achieve their dreams.



Civic Engagement

A superstar of Centenary's Educational Opportunity Program (EOP), Osaivbie "Oso" Igior '25 won national recognition from the ALL IN Campus Democracy Challenge for engaging students in the democratic process by registering fellow students to vote in the 2023 and 2024 elections.



Just four years after joining the competitive Atlantic East Conference (AEC), Centenary University is making its mark on post-season play. Five teams advanced to their respective AEC playoffs and tournaments during the 2024-2025 academic year. Back Where He Belongs

Centenary University recently appointed Pete Vincent '07 director of athletics, marking a homecoming for the former Cyclone student-athlete and experienced athletics administrator. Vincent returned to his *alma mater* with over a decade of experience in collegiate athletics, coaching, and youth development.

A native of Jersey City, Vincent has been a fixture in the New Jersey City University Department of Athletics since 2011. The former shooting guard for the Cyclones men's basketball team was a three-year player after redshirting and serving as a student-assistant coach during his freshman season. He won the Cyclone Award all four years, an honor given to student-athletes who exemplify commitment, sportsmanship, and leadership.

Vincent says of his Centenary University homecoming, "I am honored that the Centenary University administration has selected me to be the next director of athletics. I am extremely excited to come back to Cyclone Nation and devote my time and energy to making the next chapter here one of the best ever written. As a Centenary student-athlete, I had an amazing experience, both on and off the court. My goal is for every student-athlete to have the opportunity to feel the same way I feel about this wonderful place I call my second home."

EXPANDING OPPORTUNITY

Centenary University provides extraordinary educational opportunities to students from a variety of backgrounds, including first-generation college students and those facing economic challenges. Our goal: To ensure that no Centenary student drops out because of financial need.

Through the Campaign for College Scholarship Fund established in 2023, donors have provided increasing financial assistance to Centenary University students. Thanks to your support, the University awards over \$18 million in scholarships and grants every year—and 100% of Cyclones receive financial assistance.

Centenary's commitment to fostering the success of first-gen students has led to our selection as a FirstGen Forward Network member. In addition, for the past two years the University has been named a Top Performer in Social Mobility in the U.S. News & World Report Best Colleges issue, recognizing the graduation and career success of Cyclones from underserved backgrounds.



MEET THE HACKETTSTOWN SCHOLAR

Through contributions to the Campaign for College Scholarship Fund, Centenary University awards a full, four-year tuition scholarship annually to a graduate from Hackettstown High School. This year's Hackettstown Scholar is Alexander Clauson.

A member of the Hackettstown High School Class of 2025, Alex overcame a premature birth, developmental delays, and middle school bullying to excel in high school. Doubling down on his studies, he worked hard to raise his academic proficiency, achieving honor roll and acceptance into the National Honor Society.

A commitment to serving others runs through every aspect of Alex's life. In high school, he took part in a host of community service projects—including several on the Centenary Uni-



versity campus—as a member of the Key Club. He was also active in supporting the football team, assisting in the weight room and providing moral support on the sidelines of games and practices.

In addition, Alex was a member of Hackettstown High School Unified Sports, a coed program for special education students to participate in athletics with their classmates. He played soccer and basketball, and also qualified for the Special Olympics in track and field.

At Centenary, Alex is taking the first steps toward his career goal of working as a special education teacher: “So many of my own teachers and classroom aides were very supportive. They had compassion, patience, honesty, and respect. They taught me to put in a really good work ethic. Now, I want to be the kind of person who helps my students, too.”

CREATING SUSTAINABLE SUPPORT

THE GEORGE H. WHITNEY SOCIETY

Members of Centenary University's George H. Whitney Society leave a powerful legacy that impacts the future of the University and its students. Named in honor of Centenary's first president, this prestigious society enrolls benefactors who have announced their intent to include the University in their estate plans. The society's members share a strong belief in the principles and values that Centenary alumni hold dear: Small class sizes, a dedicated faculty, a beautiful campus, and exceptional students. In addition to loyal alumni, membership includes parents of former students, current and former Centenary employees, and friends of the University.

There are many personal financial advantages of establishing an estate gift to Centenary. Potential donors are encouraged to consult their attorney or financial planner for more information. Here are three easy ways to support Centenary University through a planned gift.

Bequests

A simple way to support Centenary is to specify a gift to the University in your will. This option informs your heirs of your

wishes, and can possibly reduce the taxes owed on your estate. Your bequest can be directed to The Centenary Fund or for scholarships, athletics, or other areas important to you.

Retirement Plan Assets

During your lifetime, you can specify Centenary as the recipient of required retirement plan distributions from your IRA after age 70½—and reduce your income tax burden. You also have the option of designating Centenary University as the beneficiary of your retirement account to decrease the tax burden on your estate.

Life Insurance

A donation of life insurance can provide Centenary University with future income and provides no tax liability upon your passing.

THE POWER OF PLANNED GIVING

A \$2 million estate gift from the late Louise Monez Hill '40 is making a life-changing impact on Centenary University students. Her bequest established the Grace Y. Bissett and Louise Monez Hill Scholarship, which covers the full cost of attendance for four years at Centenary—including tuition and fees, room and board, books, transportation, travel, and miscellaneous expenses—to a student who is dedicated to pursuing a career that improves race relations.

This year's Hill Scholar is first-year student Leihlani Ladipoh of Glen Burnie, Md, a high school honor student and volleyball player. A psychology major, Leihlani wants to someday work as a children's behavioral health therapist. Her commitment to increasing accessibility to mental health resources across racial and ethnic boundaries dovetails with the goals of the Grace Y. Bissett and Louise Monez Hill Scholarship.

Leihlani is the fourth Centenary student to be selected for the Hill Scholarship. Reflecting on the generosity of the donor, Leihlani said, "Mrs. Hill must have been a wonderful and very strong woman. Her donation to help students at Centenary is amazing. Now, I can focus on my studies, and later, not struggle to pay off student loans. Thanks to this scholarship, I can really breathe and not worry about my financial future."



BUILDING FOUNDATION AND CORPORATE SUPPORT

Foundations and corporations are increasingly recognizing the importance of Centenary University to the economy of northwestern New Jersey and the State of New Jersey. During the 2024-2025 academic year, foundations invested in the University to expand educational opportunities for traditional and adult students.



Through a 2-for-1 challenge from the **Reeves Foundation**, Centenary University has established a \$1 million endowed scholarship fund for Overlook Hospital registered nurses to earn a Bachelor of Science in Nursing from Centenary. Now, the University is seeking new foundation support to expand this successful scholarship program to nurses working at other New Jersey health systems.



The Douglas M. Noble Family Foundation contributed \$100,000 to support Centenary University students facing financial challenges, with a preference for first-generation college students, while **The John A. and Margaret Post Foundation** donated an additional \$100,000 to assist Centenary students with demonstrated need.



TRAC (Therapeutic Riding at Centenary) was awarded a \$20,000 grant from **PATH Intl.**, a global organization leading the advancement of professional equine-assisted services that support more than 53,000 special needs individuals. Disbursed over two years, the grant will reduce the waitlist for TRAC, which provides equestrian opportunities for adults and children with physical and cognitive disabilities, as well as specialized populations such as military veterans, at-risk youth, and residents of assisted living facilities.



Yeon Lang Cha, Ph.D., explained, "A central focus of this course is the development of scientific inquiry skills to equip students with advanced laboratory competencies. The goal of scientists who study proteomics is to understand the structures and functions of proteins."

A \$4,500 grant from **Pfizer** introduced a new course on proteomics, the study of cellular proteins and their role in the development of organisms, to the Centenary University curriculum. Awarded through the Independent Colleges and Universities of New Jersey (ICUNJ), the PURE (Pfizer Undergraduate Research Endeavors) grant provides opportunities for Centenary students to use modern technologies to work with fish proteins to develop a deep understanding of biological processes at the genetic level. Scholarship Support for Working Nurses

The RN to BSN program at Centenary University is growing—and a big reason is the Reeves Foundation 2-for-1 Scholarship Challenge. The scholarship provides up to \$3,000 for registered nurses at Overlook Hospital to complete a Bachelor of Science in Nursing at Centenary.

In September the RN to BSN enrolled its largest cohort to date, according to Rebecca Cooper, DNP, director of the program. Dr. Cooper reports that the Reeves Foundation Scholarship—as well as the program's virtual scheduling—has made Centenary an attractive option for Overlook Hospital RNs looking to advance their careers: "They're working adults—many with families—so they ask two things first. Can I fit classes into my schedule and can I afford the tuition?"

Developed in collaboration with Atlantic Health System, the RN to BSN degree creates an academic pathway for registered nurses to earn a Bachelor of Science in Nursing, providing opportunities to advance to healthcare leadership positions requiring a BSN, as well as branch out into public health and school nursing careers. The program can be completed in five semesters. Full program accreditation is now pending final review from the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education (CCNE) Accreditation Reviewer Committee in spring 2026.

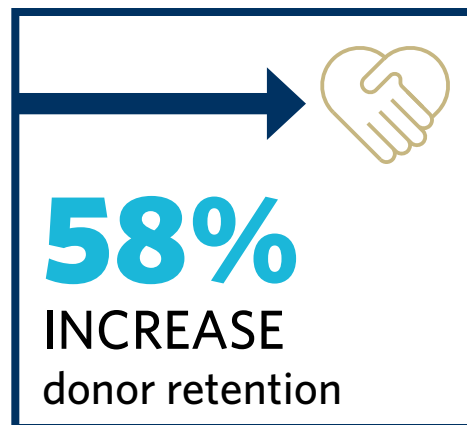
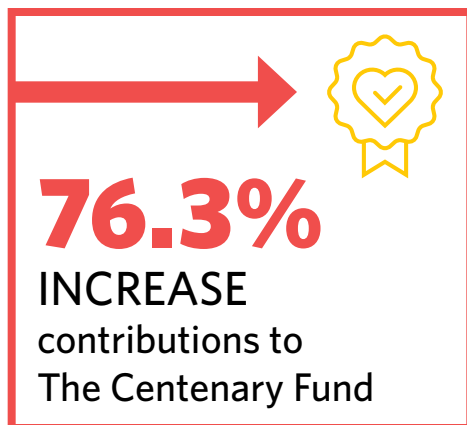
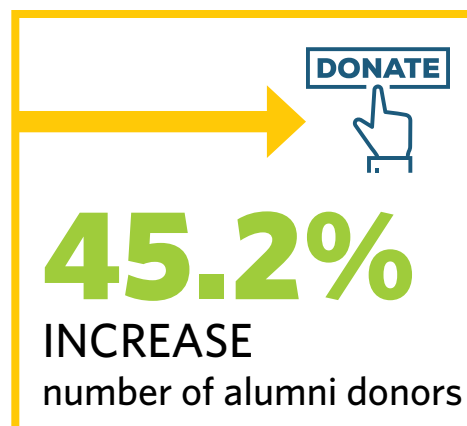
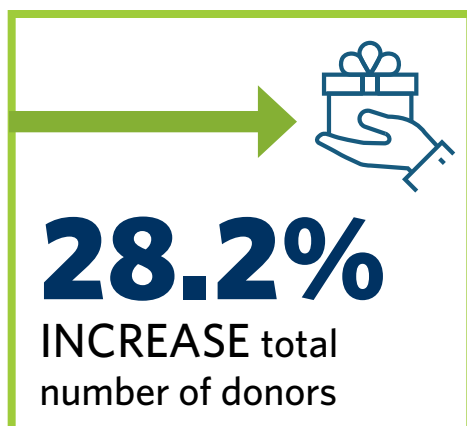
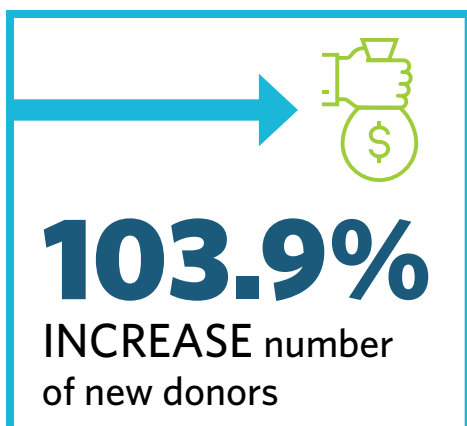
CELEBRATING A BANNER YEAR

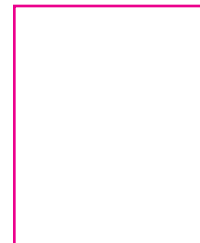
