Centenary University is committed to helping make a quality education possible for as many qualified students as we can. We awarded over \$18,000,000 of our own money to promising students through a variety of merit and need-based awards. Last year, incoming freshman averaged over \$27,000 in Centenary, state and federal grants and scholarships (free money). Let's walk through the different types of financial aid available to Centenary students!

Athletic Aid

Centenary University is an NCAA Division III school and a member of CSAC. As a Division III school, Centenary does not award aid based on athletic participation.

Specialty Award Opportunities

These scholarships and awards are renewable as long as you maintain continuous full-time enrollment and meet the minimum standards for Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP).

- **Alumni Award:** Available to children or grandchildren of Centenary alumni.
- **Centenary Educational Opportunity Program (EOP):** Available to students who are accepted into the Educational Opportunity Program.
- **Family Plan:** Available when more than one family member is enrolled. Eligibility will be reviewed each semester.
- **Hackettstown Partnership Scholarship:** One student, who will be graduating from Hackettstown High School in the current school year, may be selected each year for the scholarship which covers up to full tuition (less any federal or state grants). Students will apply through their Hackettstown High School counselor.

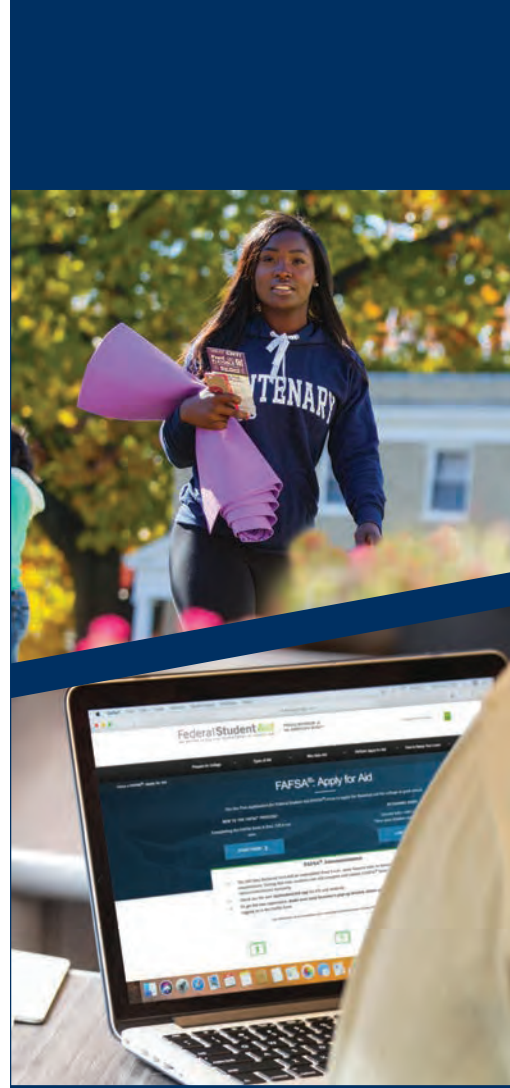
