Centenary University Tuition Discount for Eligible Veterans

Centenary University offers up to a 30% tuition discount to honorably discharged veterans. Please submit a copy of your DD214 reflecting honorable discharge to the Office of Veteran Services at Centenary University. If it is determined that you are eligible for the discount, the Office of Veteran Services will notify the University Bursar.

Orientations

Orientations for new student veterans and veteran dependents are held before the start of each semester in August and January. Sessions are held in the Veteran's Resource Center (VRC) and are designed to acclimate students to the campus and provide information about services and resources. Representatives from VA are also on-hand to answer questions and provide information.

Readjustment Counseling Services

In a co-venture with the VetCenters of Bloomfield and Secaucus, counseling appointments, both individual and group, are available at our campus space in Brotherton 011. Readjustment counselors are available on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 8am-2pm. Counseling is available to any combat arena veteran attending Centenary or residing in the greater community.

Veteran's Resource Center (VRC)

The VRC is designated space open to student veterans and veteran dependents at Centenary. The space lends itself to studying, relaxing in between classes, working on group projects, and socializing. The VRC is well-stocked with information for veterans and veteran dependents. Relevant publications, subscriptions, books, and current printed materials and brochures regarding educational and healthcare benefits through the Department of Veterans Affairs, VA Healthcare Outreach, and Vet Centers are on hand, as well as information on other services and resources.
