A SMART Investment

A Centenary education is a smart investment in your personal growth and ongoing success. The career outcomes our students achieve pay dividends for a lifetime. But what will it actually cost—and how will you pay for it? Those are good questions. This guide provides some helpful answers.

Last year alone, Centenary awarded approximately \$20 million in scholarships, grants, and awards to students like you. 100% of Centenary students receive some form of financial aid. For many families, the out-of-pocket cost for a quality, private education at Centenary University is about the same as a state school.

Admission Scholarships and Awards

In an effort to reward outstanding academic achievement, Centenary has established a variety of scholarships and awards to recognize our incoming students. Although many Centenary students demonstrate financial need, these awards are based solely on academic achievement and promise, resulting in excellent scholarship. All students who apply for admission to Centenary University are considered for these awards no matter what state or country they are coming from.

Admissions Awards Are Renewable

Students remain eligible for their Admission Scholarships and Awards as long as they maintain continuous full-time enrollment and meet the minimum standards for satisfactory academic progress. Students will need to complete the FAFSA each year to be eligible for grants.

Financial Aid

STEP-BY-STEP

The financial aid process isn't exactly the same for everyone, but everyone must follow the same basic steps described here.

1. Apply for Financial Aid

Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) online at studentaid.gov. Complete your FAFSA as soon as possible after October 1. Your eligibility for all federal, state, and Centenary grants as well as federal loans will be determined once you have been admitted and your FAFSA has been received.

Keep in mind...

- If **YOU LIVE IN NEW JERSEY**, click the link on the Confirmation page of your FAFSA to complete additional information to expedite state grant processing.
- If you are not interested in federal loans, state grants, or need-based grants, please let us know immediately so we can process your financial aid quickly.

Non-Centenary Scholarships

There are countless sources of student aid but you have to find some of them. Whenever we learn about scholarship opportunities, we post them at centu.org/scholarships. Check in regularly for updates.

2. Submit Requested Information

Occasionally additional information is needed. Please provide any requested documents as soon as possible. Keep copies of what you submit.

3. Review Your Award

Your award notice will explain what financial aid is available to you and outline your estimated costs for the upcoming year.

4. Make Payment

Financial aid may not cover all of your costs. To cover any remaining balance, you may need to consider other financing options:

Financial Aid DO'S & DON'TS

Do Fill Out That FAFSA

You MUST complete a FAFSA to access federal government loans and grants and Centenary grants. Take advantage of the IRS Data Retrieval Tool. It allows you to access the IRS information needed to complete the FAFSA. It also allows you to transfer tax return data directly into your online FAFSA application. The sooner you complete it, the better your chances of receiving aid.

Don't Delay

Many people are applying at the same time for the same finite resources. If you wait too long, grants and scholarships may be gone for the year.

Do Keep a Calendar

Note deadlines for submitting scholarship, grant, and financial aid applications.

Don't Assume

Confirm that applications and supporting documents you sent (to Centenary or anywhere else you're applying for aid) were received.

Do Be Consistent

When filling out various documents, use the same name, address, financial figures, etc. Discrepancies raise questions and that slows the process.

Don't Delay

We said that already...and can't emphasize it enough!

Quality, Private & a Great VALUE

Centenary University is committed to working with you and your family to make a Centenary education affordable for you. So talk to us. We'll help you understand FAFSA, loans, grants, and scholarships. We'll work together to try to make the money part work.

You will be automatically reviewed for merit scholarships based on academic performance, without regard to financial need. These scholarships are not need-based and are awarded based on cumulative high school GPA for freshman applicants. If you have completed a GED or have less than 24 attempted post-high school transfer credits, you will

be considered for these scholarships. If you are a transfer applicant your scholarship will be awarded based primarily on cumulative college GPA, although other factors may be considered. **You will be notified of your award in your admissions packet.**

Each year, Centenary University awards approximately \$20 million in scholarships, grants, and awards to our traditional undergraduate students. Centenary does not require a separate application for financial aid, however you should complete your FAFSA as soon as possible to ensure that you receive all aid you are eligible for.
