GETTING A GOOD START: PRE-SEMESTER THROUGH WEEK 4



- Move-in and Orientation- Last weekend in August (view website)
- Classes begin (8/28) & syllabil
 handed out
 - Start reading & look at deadlines!
 - Insert deadlines into planner
 - Grades may start coming in quickly

- Add/Drop ends 9/1
 - If you need to drop a class, do so quickly
- Getting acclimated
 - Form social connections (esp. With roommates)
 - Finding groups/clubs to join

MID-SEMESTER: WEEK 5 THROUGH WEEK 10



- Midterm Exams (start prepping early!)
 - Typically, around week 6
 - Could be first heavily weighted grade
- FAFSA Opens
 - Time to start thinking about paying for next year
- Be cautious of free time!
 - Social engagements become more frequent but be mindful of course work

- Last day to withdrawal from traditional semester-based class is 11/2
 - After this date, a withdrawal will equate to an F
- Meet with faculty advisors
- Start prepping for finals
 - If you had a midterm, you might know what to expect in terms of prepping

SEMESTER END: WEEK 11 THROUGH WEEK 16



- Register for spring classes
 - Registration begins November 6th
 - You must meet with your advisor prior
- Final Assignments
 - Give yourself enough time to complete
- Thanksgiving Break
 - November 22nd- 24th

- Final Exams
 - Important to start preparing early!
 - Typically, the last week of the semester
 - December 11th –15th
- Winter Break
 - December 18th- January 7th

- First day of class January 8
- Housing selection for 2024-2025
 - Typically, in mid-March (keep an eye on emails)
- FAFSA Deadline
 - Typically, April 1 (reminders will be sent)
- Course Registration
 - Beings March 25


- Career Success: Year 1


