Centenary University is committed to helping make a quality education possible for as many qualified students as we can. We awarded over \$18,000,000 of our own money to promising students through a variety of merit and need-based awards. Last year, incoming freshman averaged over \$28,000 in Centenary, state and federal grants and scholarships (free money). Let's walk through the different types of financial aid available to Centenary students!

These scholarships and awards are renewable as long as you maintain continuous full-time enrollment and meet the minimum standards for Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP).

- Alumni Award: Available to children or grandchildren of Centenary alumni.
- Family Plan: Available when more than one family member is enrolled. Eligibility will be reviewed each semester.
- Hackettstown Partnership Scholarship: One student, who will be graduating from Hackettstown High School in the current school year, may be selected each year for the scholarship which covers up to full tuition (less any federal or state grants). Students will apply through their Hackettstown High School counselor.


