What Is Financial Aid and How to Apply

Financial aid comes from a variety of sources including the federal government, NJ state government, Centenary University and various other outside sources.

There are three parts to applying for financial aid and you should work on all three parts at the same time. The three parts to applying for financial aid are:

- 1. Be accepted to Centenary University
- 2. Search for outside scholarships and sources of funding
- 3. Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) online at www.fafsa.gov.

Check with your employer (or your parent's employer) to determine if educational benefits are one of the
benefits they offer.
Review scholarship search engines, deadlines and specific scholarships that have been made known to

back often as this list is updated as we receive information on additional scholarships.

Complete the FAFSA

The FAFSA is FREE! It is also the application for all federal grants and loans as well as NJ state grants and Centenary grants. You can, and should, complete the FAFSA each year. You can complete the 2024-2025 FAFSA online at www.fafsa.gov. Be sure to include Centenary's federal school code of 002599 on your FAFSA.
