Application for Intensive Support

As part of Centenary University's commitment to student centered learning, the Disability Services Office offers a full range of accommodations, as well as **two programs** specifically designed to support students with learning differences who would benefit from academic coaching. These are fee-based programs that are offered to students who meet specific admission criteria.

Project ABLE is an educationally based, comprehensive learning support program designed specifically for students with psychological, learning, and neurological differences. Through this program students will be offered weekly meetings with a Student Success Specialist, a weekly interpersonal skills support group, and various seminars and activities to assist them in being successful college students.

The **STEP Ahead** Program at Centenary University is an intense pre-college program, for students with learning differences, held during Summer Session II that is designed to enhance the development of a student's self-advocacy, independence, interpersonal and academic skills. This program is not a stand-alone program and is only available to students who are first time freshman participating in Project ABLE for the fall semester.

Please use this form to apply to Project ABLE or both of the intensive support programs as outlined above. In addition, applicants must also submit disability documentation. This application should be completed by the person who is planning to enroll at Centenary University. Applications will not be reviewed until all necessary materials have been submitted.
