Format: Day camp: Monday – Thursday: **Drop off at 9 am and pick up at 3 pm**

Friday: Drop off at 9 am and pick up at 12 noon

PICK UP AND DROP OFF TIMES ARE STRICTLY ENFORCED

Requirements: Bag/Cooler with lunch and refillable water bottle; backpack or string bag with lined notebook, pens/pencils (or laptop), and sunscreen. Snacks and water will be provided and vending machines are available. Please label all coolers, lunch bags, water bottles, etc. with camper's name.

Dress code: short sleeve polo-style shirt with collar, long pants and hard-soled, closed-toed shoes or boots. Long hair must be pulled back securely, and no long or dangling jewelry.

Cell phone use is allowed at lunch breaks, but must be turned off for safety reasons in the barn and to promote active learning in the classroom. All campers are expected to be on time, attentive, and respectful of other campers, faculty, staff, students, and horses. Any violation of the CU Equestrian Center rules may result in dismissal from camp without refund.

Level I camp is open to all campers with basic horse experience; Level II camp is **ONLY** available to students who have successfully completed the Level I camp at Centenary University with Dr. Taylor in any year (including 2024), or are certified in the following United States Pony Club Levels: H-A, C-3, B and A

Important Safety Information Every student must wear the appropriate clothing listed above each day when working with our horses. All students (or parent/guardian) must sign the CU equine liability release, and are expected to follow all posted rules and regulations of the CU Equestrian Center. If student has any allergies (including food), they must be disclosed. As large portions of this camp are conducted in the barn and outside on the grounds, if a student has insect sensitivity and/or requires an epi-pen, they must disclose this information and bring the pen with them in case of emergency.
